Callaway Public-School intends to follow the Title I Parent and Family Engagement policy guidelines in accordance with the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 as listed below. The policy and the plan to implement it have been developed jointly and in agreement with parents from our building. It will be reviewed and updated annually with parent input. It will be available for all parents to review at the annual Title I meeting in a language they can understand.

An annual meeting will be held with parents to inform them about their child's participation in the Title I Program, explaining what the Title I program is and the requirements associated with it.
