Demographics

The Callaway Public School District is a 321.2 square mile class III school system located in the town of Callaway in Custer County. The district operates 5 bus routes and provides transportation for approximately 102 students. The school district employs 37 people. The economy of the area is primarily supported by agriculture, however; the Callaway District Hospital and the Good Life Center provide employment opportunities for a significant number of people.

Brief School History

The first school meeting held in Callaway was a hotly contested affair, held August 1, 1887 in the Deems Opera House; C. W. Root, moderator Dr, A. L. Mathews, director, and F. A. Clark, treasurer. The tract offered by Smith and Needham was considered the best location and their proposition was accepted, the tract located south across the creek from the original townsite. A unanimous vote was cast for a nine month school starting in September 1887, bonds voted not to exceed \$1,500 for the building. The contract for building a two-story brick schoolhouse was awarded to John Wirges and S. R. Idell. The brick was from the kiln of Mr. Wirges, of Callaway. This was the first two-story building erected in Custer County and the people of the community carried the project through by subscribing liberally in money and material to have the second story erected, there being barely enough funds in the treasury to complete one story. Student Data and Demographics

Our students take the criterion-referenced NeSA exam in the spring, as required by the state of Nebraska Department of Education. District Results for 2016-017 are as follows:

- 69% Meet or Exceed in Math
- 42% Meet or Exceed in Reading (first year of test)
- 83% Meet or Exceed in Science
- Writing is no longer tested separately

CPS was given a score of 85 on the Evidence Based Analysis (EBA) survey for AQuESTT by the NDE for 2016-2017.

Our local choice assessments for norm-referenced results are NWEA MAPS tests. The school utilizes DIBELS as our "universal screener" to help customize student instruction for all.

We had 228 students in PK-12 grades in 2016-2017. Our graduation rate was 100%, and our mobility rate was 13.5%. 13.5% of our students received special education services, and 29% of our families receive free or reduced-price lunches. Six percent of our students are non-caucasian.

grade in 1893. The bell on the school house, which was donated by the Ladies Union, was put up. The bell weighs about 200 pounds and is a beauty. It has a very sweet tone and can be heard for a long distance. This bell is now located at the west side of the Callaway School. This building was blown down and completely wrecked June 4, 1894 in a terrible storm.

About our Staff

Callaway Public School employees 21.4 certificated teachers, and two others are provided by the Sandhills Educational Services Coop (SESC) in Broken Bow. Eight of our teachers have master's degrees or higher, and the average teacher has 19.8 years of experience, compared to the statewide average of 14 years. Our base teacher salary was \$33,300 in 2016-2017, and our average teacher salary was \$48,883. Many of our staff members have been here from the very beginning of their teaching careers.



Financial Information

CPS does not receive equalization aid from the State. The majority of a \$3.4 million budget is funded by local tax dollars and federal reimbursements for special services. Our per pupil cost was just under \$15,000 for the 2016-17 school year.
