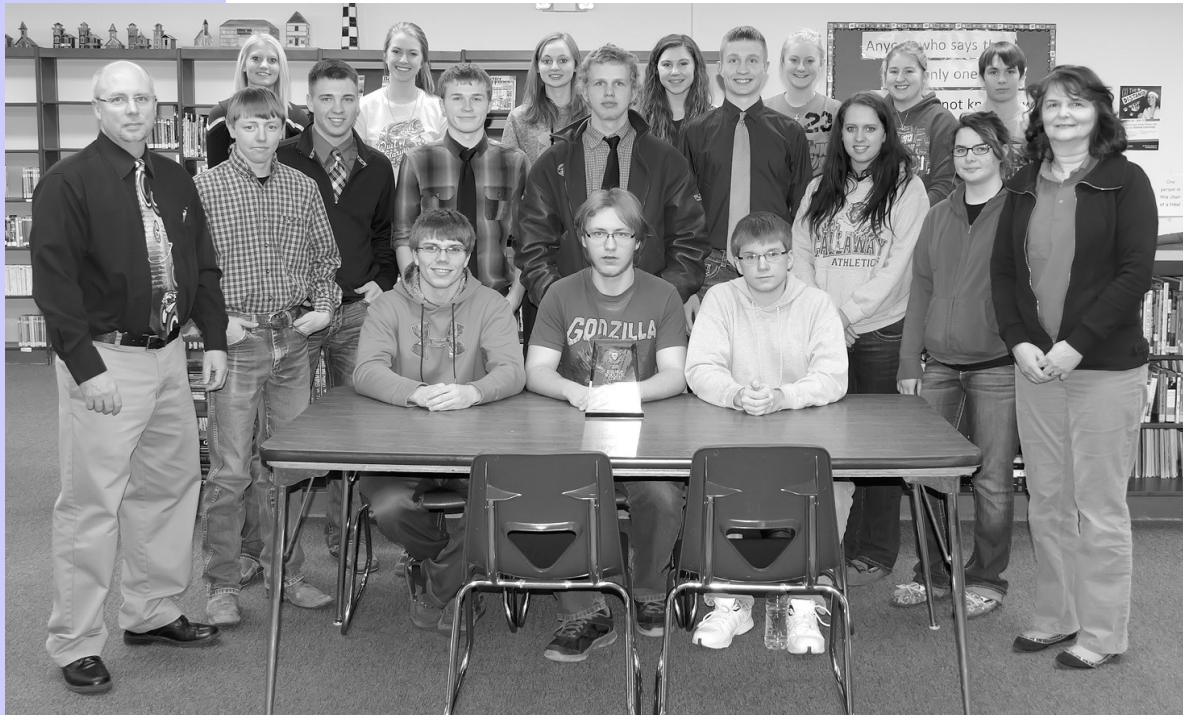

Teacher/Student Information

- ▶ In 2013–14 we employed 20.5 teachers on a fulltime basis. Of those staff members, 36% have a Master's degree, and 64% have a Bachelor's degree. Our teaching staff average 19.55 years of experience. Our student to teacher ratio is 1:10.
- ▶ Our average class size is 14.8 students per class. Students are in attendance 95% of the time. Our graduation rate is 93.33%. We have a mobility rate of 13.54%, a free and reduced lunch rate of 32.64, and 11% of our students come from ethnic backgrounds. 18.23% of our students qualify for Special Education.





Twenty students represented Callaway High School well at the 2015 Mid-Plains Community College's Inter-High Scholastic Contest and the Tech-Knowledge Fair by taking tests in a myriad of disciplines. Test takers competed against other students from all classes/divisions with points awarded for first, second, and third places. Points earned were then used to award the top three places in three separate divisions, with divisions based on high school student population. Callaway High School came away with the Division III championship in the academic contest with first places from Dakota Seng in Chemistry and Noah Edgington in North Platte Community College (NPCC) Facts, and a second place from Noah in Dramatic Arts. Jacob Mason added to the place winners in the Tech-Knowledge category with a second place finish in Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC). Callaway students finished the day in impressive style with 25 total tests taken in 14 areas. Of these 25 tests, 16 landed in the top 25% of all test scores, and scores from 11 of these tests were in the top ten, regardless of divisions. Two students just missed the third place mark with fourth place finishes.
