

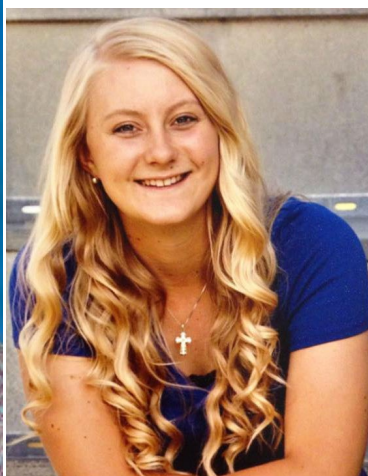


## Bobcats of the Month

## **News Release for the State FCCLA Peer Education Retreat February 29, 2016**



The Callaway FCCLA Chapter attended the FCCLA State Peer Education Retreat held in Kearney, NE on February 29, 2016. The theme of the meeting was "To Infinity and Beyond" with FCCLA! This theme took its' inspiration from the movie, Toy Story, which also coincided with the charity that was being benefited, Love Adelyn. Inspired by the death of their daughter Adelyn, Love Adelyn is an organization that was founded to raise Congenital Heart Defect (CHD) awareness, and to help ill children in need. They currently have several goals for the year, among them being to make and distribute 100 activity packets for children in hospitals. Nebraska FCCLA contributed to that goal by donating over 1800 items.

In addition, there were several speakers and sessions. The keynote speaker was Neil Halford, who presented "Victim or Victor." Neil was a former wrestler, earning his way to Nebraska State Wrestling. The only catch? An accident when he was two years old left him blind. In his session, Neil shared his inspiring struggle and journey of his success.

Another session was "To infinity and Beyond with SPOT!" In this session, the State Peer Officers educated members about Peer Teams and how to use FCCLA as a tool for success. The Royal Family Kids' Camp presented a session, entitled "Treating Every Child like Royalty" and a local speaker, Sara Giboney, presented "How to Create an Online Career in Wellness."

There were many awards given at Peer Retreat. Callaway's own, Hannah Pearson, is a finalist for the State Peer Officer Team for the 2016-2017 school year. The team name is Career Leader and its focus is on the National Program, Career Connection.

### **NPCC Academic Inter-High Day**



Nineteen Callaway High School students headed to North Platte Community College (NPCC) to compete academically for top honors, scholarships, and; ultimately, a team trophy. These students competed against other students in all divisions--divisions being based on a school's high school population. Points earned from the top three

test results were then used to determine division leaders, and trophies given for the top three schools in each of the three divisions. Some great performances awarded Callaway High School a third place trophy in Division III. Isaac Stallbaumer placed first in Physics/Engineering and third in Mathematics, while Noah Edgington placed second in NPCC facts. Each of these top three placing earned Isaac and Noah one 3-credit-hour scholarship to be used for enrollment in a college summer course.

Of the 28 total tests taken by these 19 students, 14 of those test results ranked in the top 10, with some tests having as many of 56 test takers. This is very commendable when considering results were calculated with disregard to a school's division.

Five freshman and sophomore boys also took advantage of this time to become involved in Tech-Knowledge Day, whereby they experienced hands-on activities in the various technical areas offered by the college. Some of these areas included Auto Body, Auto-Diesel Mechanics, Building Construction, Welding and Metals, and Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC).

"What a great day for our students who not only represented our school well academically, but were a commendable representation of themselves and our school". Sponsoring the event were Dr. Beshaler and Mr. Ellis.

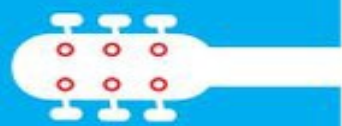

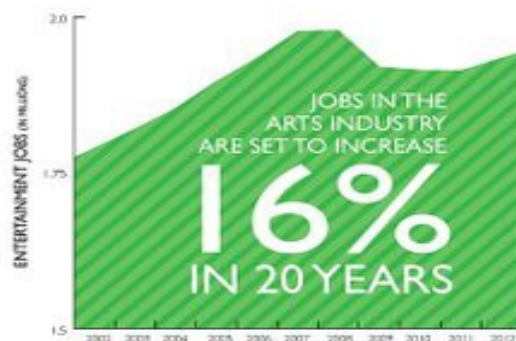
