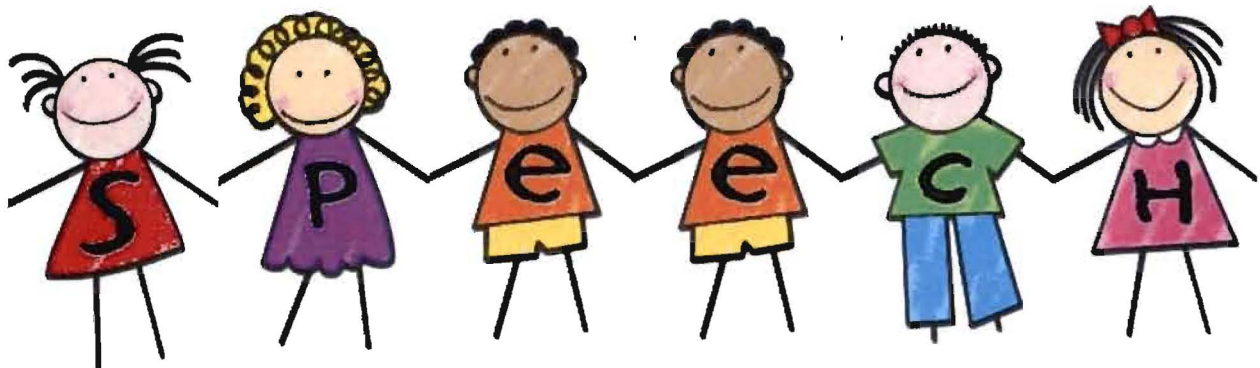

The Cat's out of the Bag!!

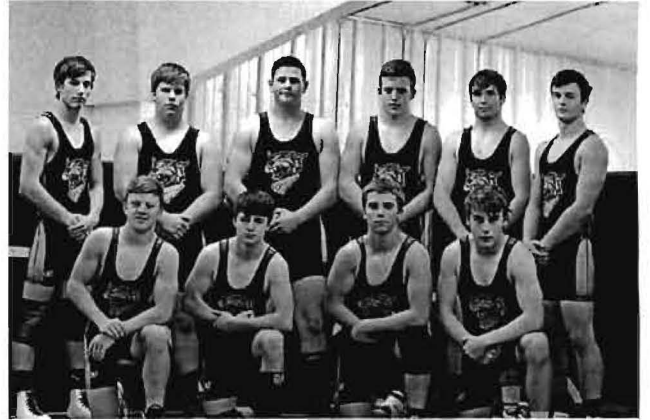

Mr. Ellis

What is the purpose of this assignment?- To show a practical application of the ideas of ratio and proportion, show how geometric shapes fit together, develop an appreciation for the relationships between math and art, use scale factor, development of cooperative learning and interaction, and development of critical assessment of self and others.

What is the criteria for this assignment?- Their projects must contain all polygons, no circles, have at least 15 pieces, have no more than 35 pieces, must contain at least 1 triangle of any classification, must contain at least 1 quadrilateral, and have symmetry.

What is your favorite part of this assignment?- "I like watching the students go from having to have me doing everything, to actually having independence in doing it on their own. I also like that they can relate art to math, because I have very many talent art students in my class that may not be as good at math, so it adds that understanding."

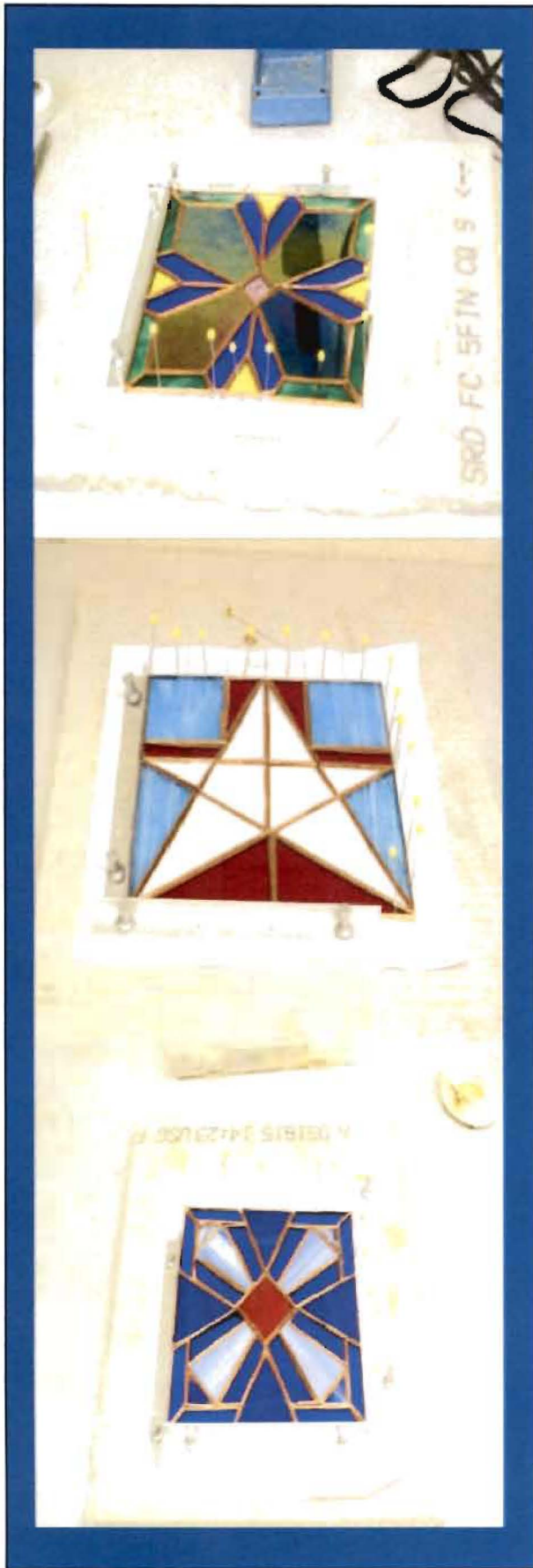

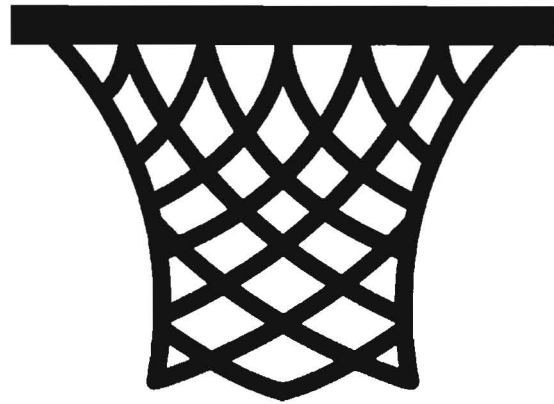

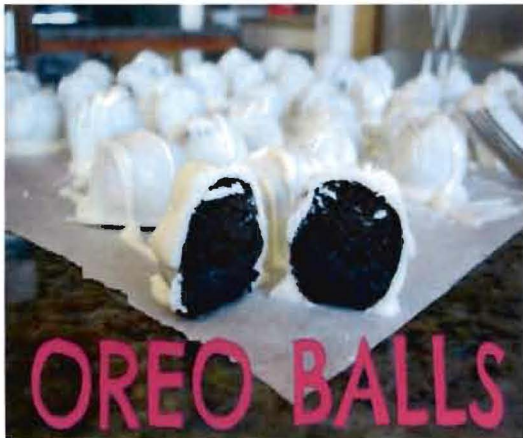


2016 FCCLA Cookie Sales

Most scholarships are based on academics, but others are based on community service, school involvement, or talent in art, dance, music, or athletics. Some are based on financial need as determined by the [FAFSA](#) (Free Application for Federal Student Aid).

It's time to start applying for scholarships. Here's where you can find them:

- [ScholarshipQuest](#) at [EducationQuest.org](#) features over 2,000 Nebraska-based scholarships. After you create a profile, you'll be matched with scholarships that fit your criteria.
- **Your school counselor's office.** Visit regularly to check on local and national awards.
- **The college you plan to attend.** Contact the school for a list of scholarships they provide and application procedures.
- **National search sites** such as [College Board](#), [Peterson's](#) and [Chegg](#).
- **Other resources** could include your coach, clubs and organizations, and your parents' employers and civic organizations.
