The Film

A suicide attempt left 16-year-old varsity cheerleader, Emma Benoit, paralyzed, but propelled her on a mission to use her painful experience to **help others find hope and stay alive.**

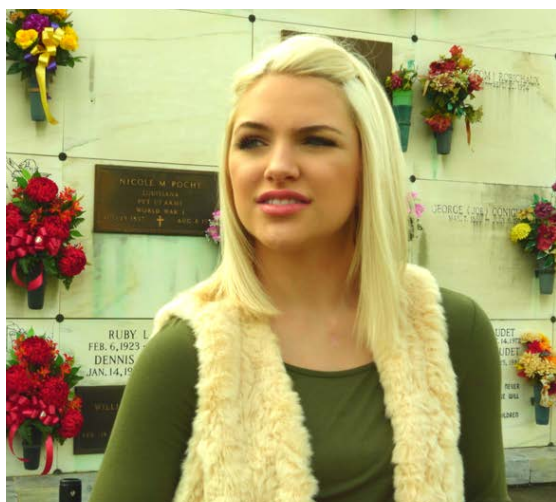
MY ASCENSION is a feature length documentary that chronicles Emma's inspiring journey and quest to walk again, as she works to bring Hope Squad, a school-based suicide prevention program, to Louisiana.

The film also highlights the stories of two remarkable young people who tragically did not survive their attempts, and we learn first-hand from their families, friends, school officials and suicide prevention experts about the devastating effects of suicide and **what can be done to prevent it.**

Why this film is needed

Suicide is a silent epidemic that is not receiving the attention it deserves. It is the second leading cause of death for young people under 25 and there are approximately 1.2 million suicide attempts every year. The ripple effects of these deaths and attempts devastate millions more.

MY ASCENSION shines light on the reality of this ongoing public health crisis and is positively impacting the lives of young people, families, schools, and communities by sharing hope, information and best practices that can be replicated around the world.

When suicide attempt survivors, such as Emma, share their stories of recovery, it often prevents others from attempting.

Emma's ability to tell her story in such an honest way creates a space for others to speak freely about their own issues with mental health.

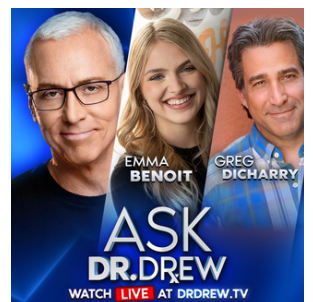
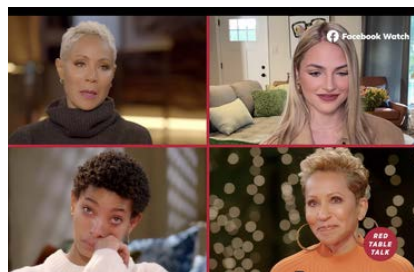

Over 150 "My Ascension" screenings events have been held nationwide, that have inspired and educated over 25,000 attendees.

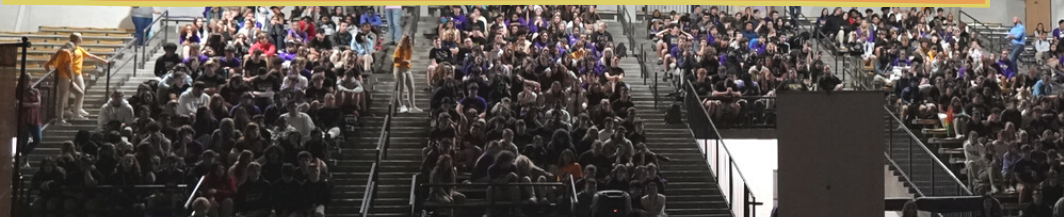

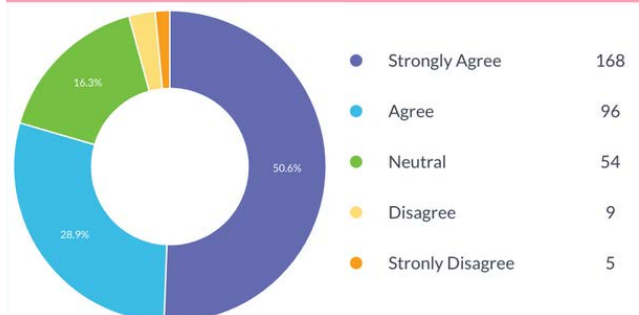
